SHEVITZ RECEIVES ADVOCACY AWARD AT CONFERENCE

Inda Shevitz was awarded The Equity and Social Justice Advocacy Award by the National Association for Multicultural Education (NAME). This prestige's award was presented to Linda at the 22nd Annual NAME International Conference in Philadelphia, PA on December 1, 2012.

Linda is a committed member of the Maryland Multicultural Coalition Chapter of NAME, since its inception, which reflects her long term commitment to advocacy and social justice in schools and society. Her commitment to using her status, skills, and expertise to advocate *publicity* and *explicitly* to fight for equity and social justice, make her a model of integrity for social justice advocacy. She has exercised that advocacy as the current Branch Chief of the Maryland State Department of Education Equity Assurance and Compliance Branch and in her twenty years of service as its Equity Specialist.

Linda exemplifies the spirit and content of this award. She has tirelessly worked in numerous statewide organizations, countering discrimination and inequities in all forms. These include groups such as the Maryland Consortium on Human Relations, The Maryland Multicultural Coalition, and COVE, the Coalition Opposed to Violence and Extremism. She coordinates the state wide Task Force on Education that is Multicultural and Achievement, composed of representatives of every school system in the state.

Since the early 1980's Linda was the driving force behind the Maryland Women's History Project, coordinating the creation of innovative packets of information that went to every school in the state each year. She has been a prime leader in the development of the Maryland Women's Heritage Center, where she serves as the program coordinator and a member on the Board of Board of Directors. Most recently, she

chaired the development of the STEM, Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math exhibit at the center, working with many groups, including NASA/Godard Space Center.

Her dedication and advocacy have gone far beyond the state of Maryland. She was chair of AGELE, the Association for Gender Equity Leadership in Education and works with the National Coalition for Woman and Girls in education, NCWGE. For several years she coordinated the Film Festival at the International Conference of NAME.

Even more impressive, beyond the programs and resources that she provides, is the incredible person that she is. Linda is selfless and unassuming but has inner strength and

warmth that engages people coming from diverse backgrounds to work effectively together. She believes in the importance of an inclusive perspective on educational equity and social justice and models it in absolutely everything that she does. She is the rare leader who can also be a partner and supporter, encouraging others to work together respectively to achieve common visions. She has brought these qualities to

her newest role, as Director of the Office of Equity Assurance at MSDE.

2013 JACK EPSTEIN AWARD FOR CONTRIBUTIONS TO MULTICULTURAL EDUCATION



The Maryland Multicultural Coalition/Chapter of NAME (MMC/NAME) presents an award each spring at its annual statewide conference. This year the conference will be held in Baltimore County at Parkville High School, on April 20, 2013.

The award will recognize exemplary commitment to Education that is Multicultural in Maryland. Nominees may be educators or others who are dedicated to creating educational environments in which all people are valued equally and where all are inspired to work together in schools and communities. Outstanding examples of multicultural activities, programs or multiculturalism in an educational setting may also be nominated for recognition.

NAME CRITERIA

Nominees may include (but need no be limited to) teachers, support personnel, volunteers, counselors, administrators, specialists, coordinators, directors, and community activists. Nominees may work in public or private organizations and must live or work in Maryland. Members of the MMC/NAME Executive Board may not be nominated.

Only one nominator is required for each nomination. Anyone may make a nomination, whether the nominator is a NAME member or not. All nomination forms must bear the signature of the person making the nomination along with his/her home address, day and evening phone numbers, and email address.

Completed nomination forms and supporting documents are to be mailed to MMC/NAME, P O Box 738, Columbia, MD 21045. Nominations must be postmarked or delivered no later than March 11, 2013.

Each nomination must include as supporting documents:

One letter of support. (Additional letters of support may be included.)

A brief biographical sketch of the individual or overview of the program.

Materials from projects, newspaper clippings and other support material may be submitted. Support material should relate to the reasons the nominee is being nominated. The MMC/NAME Executive Board may solicit additional information if it is deemed necessary. The nomination form and support materials will become the property of MMC/NAME.

The final decision on awards to be presented will be made by the MMC/NAME Executive Board. The Executive Board may appoint a sub-committee to review nominations and make

recommendations to the Board for a final decision.

The award will be in the form of a certificate from MMC/NAME, recognition at the MMC/NAME Annual Conference and in the pages of the MMC/NAME newsletter, *VOICES*.
