The Mid –Atlantic Equity Consortium Celebrates Its 25th Anniversary

This November, the Mid-Atlantic Equity Consortium (MAEC) celebrated its 25th Anniversary commemorating its achievements and contributions for more than two decades. The MAEC's goal is... Promoting excellence and equity in education to achieve social justice. Its central office is located in Bethesda, Maryland and it is one of four Regional Equity Centers coordinated across the nation by the U.S. Department of Education.

The 14 states served by MAEC are the Mid-Atlantic and New England states as well as Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands. More than 150 educators and community equity activists attended the 25th celebration event, which also presented awards to local equity leaders. Noted presenters at the conference included James Counts Early of the Smithsonian Institution and Dr. Ysaye M. Barnwell, composer, author and member of the acclaimed choral group, Sweet Honey on the Rock.

As a nationally recognized center of Education Equity, the MAEC is directed by longtime acclaimed education and social justice leader, its President Susan Shaffer. Susan was honored and thanked for her leadership and was presented with a special tribute by noted education leaders, Jill Moss Greenberg, Board Member of MAEC, Jill Christianson, Equity Specialists at the National Education Association, and Linda Shevitz, former Equity Specialists at the Maryland State Department of Education.


Jack Epstein Award

The following pages of this newsletter include the scholarship application for the 2018 year. We encourage you to share this form with colleagues, friends and students for consideration. Each year we have awarded between one and three scholarships to worthy candidates that wish to be teachers. Candidates must be a current resident of the state of Maryland. The application process includes two letters of reference, an official transcript, the application and an essay. The scholarships are awarded in July 2018 and payment is made to the college or university directly. The amount awarded is between \$500.00 and \$1,000 each.

- · _Be a resident of Maryland
- · _ Have a cumulative 3.5 GPA or higher
- \cdot _Be eligible to graduate in June of the year of application
- · _ Provide proof of acceptance in a 2 or 4-year undergraduate program
- · _Intend to teach P-12 upon completion of an undergraduate program
- ·_Attach a copy of your official transcript
- ·_Attach two letters of recommendations. One must be personal (family members excluded) and the other should be school related.

Requirements for **Undergraduate College** Applicant must:

- · _Be a resident of Maryland
- \cdot Be a current undergraduate student in one of Maryland's colleges or universities
- \cdot _Have a cumulative 3.5 GPA or higher
- · _Intend to teach P-12 upon completion of an undergraduate program
- · _Attach a copy of official transcript
- ·_Attach two letters of recommendations. One must be personal (family members excluded) and the other should be school related.
